THANK YOU FOR MAKING A DIFFERENCE!

Throughout the year we have been urged to "Give Until It Makes You Feel Good." The HUMC congregation has responded to that slogan with loving hearts and generous contributions. At the beginning of the year we faced a short-fall of about \$240,000 in the current expense budget. Because of your generosity we have met all of our current expense obligations.

So far we have almost \$900,000 in pledges for the coming year. Some folks have not turned in their commitment cards. Our hope is to top last year's commitments.

We are about to embark on the campaign to "burn the mortgage" on the church facility. Our church has done marvelously well in building an outstanding facility. In our Get Acquainted process we learned that eliminating the debt is the number one church goal. We are well on the way to working out the details of that Mortgage Reduction Fund.

In 2014 we supported various outreach projects in the amount of \$263,849 in cash gifts. Beneficiaries included thousands of projects that are included in our United Methodist Shared Ministry Fund, including Africa University, the Ministerial Education Fund and the Black College Fund. In the coming months we'll share updates on some of those projects.

We can feel good that some of the familiar beneficiaries of your generosity are: Feed My Sheep, A Future With Hope, UMCOR Disaster Relief, Hope School, World Communion Fund, YMCA Camp, Children's Fresh Air Fund, Respond, IHOC, Interfaith Care Givers, Pastor's Compassionate Care Fund, Neighborhood Center, Fellowship House, United Methodist Homes, Robin's Nest, Henderson Settlement, One Great Hour of Sharing and the Generation Change Fund. In outreach mission we have also been active in donating back packs, bears, food plus hands-on volunteers for tutoring at Fellowship House, deliveries to Henderson Settlement, Neighborhood Center summer camp here at HUMC, tutors, Operation Bear Hug, the summer Mission Blitz, Sandy Relief work, the Domical Republic Mission, Give Kids The World Mission, and more. Our congregation expressed its generosity at Christmas time with the Alternative Giving emphasis that garnered \$3,610 for Robin's Nest, Fellowship House, Neighborhood Center, Angel Tree, Interfaith Care Givers, Respond, and the Pastor's Compassionate Care Fund.
